Competition


The ASABE Robotics Student Design
Competition is an event where students can enhance their skills in robotic systems, electronics, and sensing technologies by creating a fully autonomous robot for an agricultural task. This year, Torc Robotics sponsored a group of Huston-Tillotson computer science students.

A committed team of four students invested months in constructing an autonomous robot designed to tend to strawberry plants autonomously.

Beginning with rigorous preliminary rounds, the competition wrapped the next day in the final round. Despite not securing a placement, our students showed resilience, actively observing and assimilating knowledge from the successful finalists.
